2019 – 2020 fiscal year for MLCS featured the following events:

- Donations to Stillwater Bluffs Legacy Fund from art show Nov. 8 2019. The art show fundraiser went very well. A lot of the art sold, in the amount of around \$10,000.
- MLCS received approx. \$2500 in donations through Ted Crosley's memorial fund. The project, "Ted Talks Through Trees" was organized by Lesley. Little Hut Curry contributed with a fundraiser supper that raised about \$500. It became a big success with the PRT Tree Nursery offering 1000 trees instead of the number that the funds we had would have bought. Then they donated another 1000. The event at the United Church scheduled to teach all the people receiving trees how to plant and care for them was cancelled due to Covid, so the recipients all had to be instructed individually, and the trees were mostly delivered by MLCS volunteers. Some were picked up from Lesley's place. A terrific project and great success in spite of the challenges of Covid19.
- March 14 Seedy Sat., a significant annual event for promotion for MLCS was cancelled due to Covid19.
- The 2020 Newsletter was produced by the ED for the March Board meeting.
- The ED and Pres. met with property owners again to discuss with them their desire to covenant their land on the north side of Lund.
- The June board meeting was held outside at Willingdon Beach due to Covid19 restrictions. Nice day but windy and chilly.
- We were approached by a community member whose property backs onto the forest south of Penticton Street with a concern for the public use of the land. Investigations involved a local Biologist, the City of Powell River, a conservation officer, and the Province. Outcome still pending as to the actual status of the WHA we thought was in effect there.
